WORK IN PROGRESS

- How to measure quotas? (with M Quaas) *We investigate by how far the growth-overfishing problem can be mitigated by simply switching from the second-best quota in terms of biomass to a quota in terms of numbers.*
- Risk and risk exposure in Norwegian Fisheries (with L Nøstbakken, A Richter, and F Skjeret) *We look at levels and trends of risk and risk exposure in the Norwegian fishing fleet by analyzing a large dataset of landing tickets.*
